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Transnational Youth Open Debate: “European Parliament Elections

The Transnational Youth Open Debate, which took place in Copenhagen from May 27–30, 2024, brought together leaders and young voters to discuss and debate important topics in the next European elections. This event, which was hosted at Mellemfolkelige Samvirke's Freedom & Solidarity Rooms, inspired young people to discuss fundamental democratic issues while offering useful resources for civic engagement.

Highlights of the Event:

- Mock Debates: Subjects such as lowering the voting age and requiring voting sparked insightful discussions and critical analysis of the principles underlying EU democracy.
- Voting Toolbox Workshop: In order to equip young voters with the tools they need to understand the voting process, participants created a toolkit.
- Discussion with EP Candidates: Young people had the opportunity to voice their concerns and communicate with decision-makers directly during an interactive Q&A session with candidates for the European Parliament.
- Europa Experience Field Trip CPH: Young voters were given a sense of urgency and duty through an educational excursion that centered on comprehending the European democracy issue.

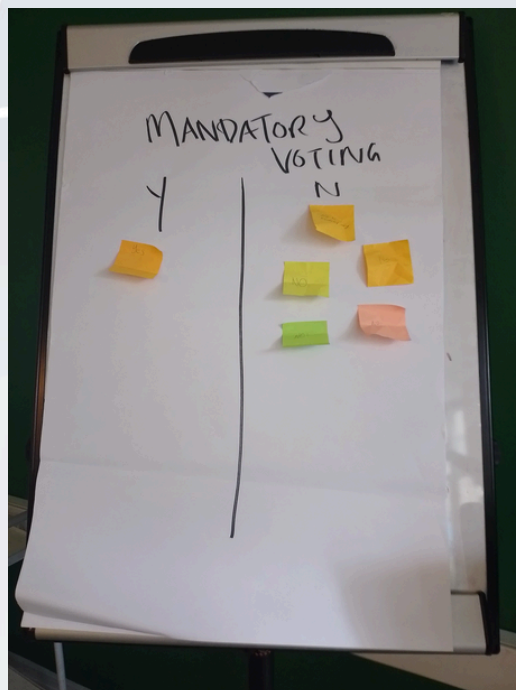
